This course, based on the instructor's best-selling book, *The Secrets of Economic Indicators*, identifies key macroeconomic indicators that have a shown track record of accurately forecasting economic and financial trends. The session spends little time on theory, and instead analyzes economic indicators under current market conditions.

In this two-day workshop, participants will learn how to identify and adjust to geopolitical risks in the world. This course deals little with theory. Instead, it uses current, real world examples of existing and potential hot spots around the world that can directly affect the value of financial and hard assets. This class will not rely on mathematical models, but draw on intuitive analysis to see how certain geopolitical shocks might sway financial markets. In some instances, the repercussions can be minor and transient. In others, the results can be long term and transformative. One thing is certain: a better understanding of geopolitical threats and their consequences has become increasingly important skill to successfully manage and protect assets in the future.
